


Year 1



Year 5







What Parents & Carers Need to Know about EA SPORTS FC 24

After two decades of holding the official FIFA licence, EA Sports' phenomenally successful football video game series has embarked on a solo run at goal. This season's iteration marks the debut appearance of a new name and branding, but don't let those fool you - EA Sports FC 24 is still a very similar proposition to last year's FIFA 23. Popular features such as Ultimate Team remain a big focus, meaning that potentially costly in-game spending is still among the line-up of risks that parents and carers should be aware of.

AGE RESTRICTION

RECURRING RELEASES
EA Sports FC 24 effectively picks up the FIFA franchise meaning that after a year, we can expect EA Sports FC 25 to hit the shelves. Updates between versions of the game are intended to be minor, but young fans of the game are advised to wait for the new edition in around 12 months time, so they can keep playing with updated team kits, players and special kits.

OFFENSIVE VOICE CHAT
FIFA 23 introduced cross-platform play, and EA Sports FC 24 games a step further with Clubs, Seasons and Friendlies from console, PC and across PlayStation 5, Xbox Series X and Switch. EA Sports FC 24 offers fun for youngsters who love to play with their friends online. However, a much wider audience (potentially open lines of communication between children and for older online gamers).

IN-GAME PURCHASES
In FIFA, Ultimate Team proved to be a profitable innovation for developers Electronic Arts (EA), and is now found in many of their other titles. Players spend in-game currency to recruit better footballers for their team, but this process can take an frustratingly long time - so young fans may be tempted to skip the grind by paying their 'real' cash to unlock that coveted star footballer.

ULTIMATE TEAM SCAMMERS
Since the mode was introduced, Ultimate Team has been a target of scammers who attempt to copy players into trading or selling outside the terms of service from EA and console manufacturers. This shady practice can lead to accounts being banned and in-game items being lost. In some cases, young players have also been hoodwinked into handing over their payment details to a fraudster.

POTENTIAL FOR ADDICTION
Just like real-life football, EA Sports FC 24 offers a thrilling, dynamic blend of tactical decisions and skill that fans find absolutely engaging. Younger players in particular, who do not understand the mechanics of a gaming console as they plead for 'just one more game', before bedtime or spend practically all weekend playing more matches to earn additional Ultimate Team packs.

Get your ultimate team

CONTROL SPENDING
If your child enjoys Ultimate Team mode, check that your payment details aren't linked to their device. For those who aren't ready to start at just £1, so on an in-game currency to purchase players. You might consider setting your child an in-game allowance, or perhaps through a prepaid card, so it's easy to stop to realise that online spending has a real-world effect.

DEFEND AGAINST SCAMMERS
EA does protect players via email (although not via text for accessibility or convenience, so watch out for their text alerts), but never through the game itself - so be wary of phishing messages and consider blocking and reporting suspicious emails. Your child should avoid trading clubs (in-game currency) from external sites, as could find them losing their money and being banned from game.

AVOID EXTRA TIME
Many parents or young football-obsessed gamers worry about their child playing too much EA Sports FC. One often used a counter indicator that is a bit of a struggle to disengage from the game, the clock in the game should be set to 15 minutes, so some stronger action by utilizing the parental controls on their console or phone.

SHOW TOXIC CHAT THE RED CARD
Playing EA Sports FC 24 with friends is highly enjoyable, but if competitive types start to turn toxic online, it can ruin everyone's fun. You could occasionally turn on the voice chat of your child's game, for any warning signs that things may be about to boil over. This goes double when playing online with strangers, voice contact with unknown players can be turned off in the game's settings.

CELEBRATE THE VARIETY
Ultimate Team may be the game's 'star player', but there's plenty more to do in EA Sports FC 24 - including modes which allow decades of all of football's best players without needing to spend money on packs to unlock them. This new version of the game includes even more women's teams, making a good step toward its representation: an important subject to discuss and celebrate with children.

Penalty Notices

A guide to Education Welfare Services

What is a Penalty Notice?

A Penalty Notice is a fine that can be issued under section 444A and section 444B of the Education Act 1996. The fine is issued per parent, per child for:

- Leave of absence of 12 school sessions /6 school days or more (within any 100 school session period) during term time, without authorisation from the school, for a holiday for example
- Unauthorised absence of 12 school sessions /6 school days or more (within any 100 school session period) of absence from school, either when a parent fails to provide an explanation, or an explanation is provided but the school consider it insufficient to authorise
- Unauthorised lateness of 12 school sessions /6 school days or more (within any 100 school session period), resulting from arrival at school after the register has closed

NB A Penalty Notice can be issued for any combination of the above reasons, where the unauthorised absence from school results in 12 sessions /6 school days or more (within any 100 session period)

Or, when:

- A pupil is observed in a public place during school hours, in the first five school days of a period of exclusion from school, without reasonable justification

Who can be issued with a Penalty Notice?

Parents and carers of a child can be issued with a Penalty Notice. The definition of a 'parent' as set out in section 576 of the Education Act 1996: By virtue of this section 'parent' includes: all natural parents, whether they are married or not; any person or body who has parental responsibility for a child (as defined by the Children Act 1989) and any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child. Having care of a child means a person who lives with and looks after a child, irrespective of what their relationship is with said child.

How much is a Penalty Notice fine?

A Penalty Notice carries a fine of £60.00 if paid within 21 days of issue, doubling to £120.00 if paid after 21 but within 28 days.

Attendance Information

Penalty Notices are issued per parent, per child.

Therefore, for example, if there are two parents and two children, the fines will total £240.00 if paid within 21 days and £480.00 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days.

Can a Penalty Notice be paid in instalments?

No. Penalty Notices must be paid in full, within the designated dates. However, if a parent has more than one child and is therefore issued with more than one fine, they can pay the fines separately if they wish.

Who is responsible for issuing Penalty Notices?

It is a Headteacher's decision whether or not to authorise an absence and, if their decision is not to authorise, they have the right to request a Penalty Notice in line with their attendance policy process. Cornwall Council's role is to check that the evidence submitted is compliant with Cornwall Council's Code of Conduct for Education Related Penalty Notices and, if so, to issue as appropriate.

Can a parent appeal a Penalty Notice?

There is no statutory right of appeal once a Penalty Notice has been issued. If you believe that the Penalty Notice should not have been issued, you should make contact with the school or academy that your child attends at your very earliest convenience after receiving the Penalty Notice. If you wish to discuss the Penalty Notice procedure, you can contact Cornwall Council's Education Welfare Service on **01872 323400**, or email educationwelfare@cornwall.gov.uk

How is a Penalty Notice paid?

Penalty Notices can be paid by card by calling the office on 01872 323400. Alternatively, payment can be made by cash or cheque at any Cornwall Council Information Service. If the 21st/28th day for payment falls on a weekend or bank holiday, payment will be accepted at the same rate on the following working day.

What happens if a Penalty Notice is not paid?

If a Penalty Notice is not paid within the 28 days of issue (as per the dates listed on the Penalty Notice), Cornwall Council will progress the matter to the Magistrates' Court, for the offence of failing to ensure regular attendance, NOT for failure to pay the fine.

If found guilty:

- under section 444(1), it can result in the parent being fined up to £1000
- under section 444(1A), it can result in the parent being fined up to £2,500 and/or receiving a custodial sentence of up to 3 months

Cornwall Council may also apply for costs incurred in taking the matter to court.
