# Communication and Language Development

Term: Autumn

Focus: How do we listen to others?

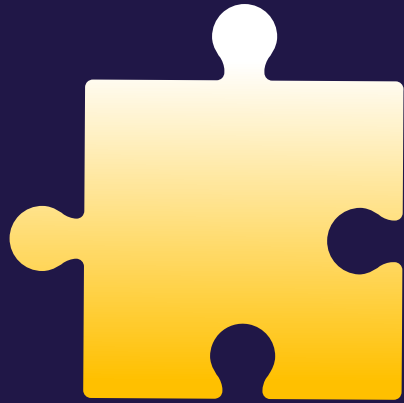
We are learning to understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.

We are learning to listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.

We are learning to listen carefully to rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound.

We are learning to use new vocabulary throughout the day.

We are learning to ask questions to find out more and to check we understand what has been said to us.



# Personal, Social and Emotional

**Term:** Autumn

**Focus:** How can we share how we are feeling with others?

We are learning to express our feelings and consider the feelings of others. We are learning to see ourselves as a valuable individual. We are learning to build constructive and respectful relationships.

We are learning to understand how it feels to belong and that we are similar and different

We are learning to know how we are feeling today.

We are learning to recognise and manage our feelings at school

We are learning to enjoy working with others to make school a good place to be.

We are learning to know what being responsible means

We are learning to understand why it is good to be kind and use gentle hands



# Physical Development

**Term:** Autumn

**Focus:** How do we develop strength, balance and co-ordination?

We are learning to develop the overall body strength, co-ordination, balance and agility needed to engage successfully with future physical education sessions and other physical disciplines including dance, gymnastics, sport and swimming. We are learning to use our core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or sitting on the floor. We are learning to combine different movements with ease and fluency.

We are learning to progress towards a more fluent style of moving, with developing control and grace. We are learning to develop our small motor skills so that we can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. Suggested tools: pencils for drawing and writing, paintbrushes, scissors, knives, forks and spoons. We are learning to develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient.

We are learning to further develop the skills we need to manage the school day successfully: lining up and queuing, mealtimes and personal hygiene.



# Literacy

**Term:** Autumn

**Focus:** What sounds can we hear?

We are learning to read individual letters by saying the sounds for them.

We are learning to blend sounds into words, so that we can read short words made up of known letter sound correspondences.

We are learning to read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds.

We are learning to form lower-case and capital letters correctly.

We are learning to spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s.

We are learning to enjoy and join in with familiar stories and be able to retell them



# Maths

Term: Autumn

**Focus:** How do we identify and order objects and numbers?

As mathematicians, we are learning to link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value.

As mathematicians, we are learning to match sort and compare amounts, continue, copy and create repeating patterns.

As mathematicians, we are learning to explore shapes, the attributes of particular shapes, and select shapes to fulfil a particular need.

As mathematicians, we are learning to use the language of position and direction.

As mathematicians, we are learning to understand the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers to 5.

As mathematicians, we are learning to explore the composition of numbers to 5.

As mathematicians, we are learning to explore length, weight and capacity.
