

Regular **school attendance** is a very **important** part of giving children the best possible start in life. The aim should be to attend **100%** of the time.


How to help...

Absence and Recent Government Changes


A new national framework for penalty notices for school absences came into effect from Monday 19 August 2024.

- A penalty notice must be considered if a child has 10 **unauthorised** sessions for any reason (equivalent to 5 school days) within a 10 school week period.
- There will be an increase in the penalty fine from £60 to £80 if paid in 21 days. If the fine is not paid by the first 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being issued.




- Gates open at 8:20am

Boom Reader - This app allows children, staff and adults at home to all easily record children's reading in one place. Children can have multiple books logged at once. When the book has been read, children will quiz using Accelerated Reader and are aiming to achieve 80% +.








Reading for pleasure

We deliver training to many schools throughout the year, sharing our expertise and practice.







Our Curriculum

Talk for Reading and Talk for Writing

Talk for Writing is a teaching framework that enables children to imitate the language they need for a particular unit orally, before reading and analysing it and then writing their own versions.

Talk for Reading compliments our Talk for Writing approach, enriching and interweaving in our writing curriculum. Talk for Reading focuses on developing the comprehension strand, structured in a way that supports children to

oping the comprehension strand, structured in a way that supports children to read critically, appreciatively and confidently. This approach, like Talk for Writing uses the gradual release of responsibility model, shifting children from depend-



Maths

Throughout the year in maths, the children will cover the following areas: Place value, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division, Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, Converting units of measure, Area and Perimeter, Ratio, Statistics, Shape and Position and direction.

Science

Throughout the year in science, the children will cover the following units: Rocks and soils, light, animals including humans, plants and forces.

Religious Education

Throughout the year in RE, the children will learn about the following religions: Christianity and Hinduism.

Physical Education

Throughout the year in PE, the children will cover the following units: Fundamentals, Dance, Football, Gymnastics, Netball, Athletics, Tennis and Yoga.

PSHE

Throughout the year in PSHE, the children will cover the following units: Being me in the world, Celebrating difference, Dreams and Goals, Healthy Me, Relationships and Changing Me.

Computing

Throughout the year in computing, the children will cover the following units: Coding, Online Safety, Email, Simulations and Touch Typing.

History and Geography

Throughout the year in history and geography, the children will cover the following units: Stone Age to Iron Age, Ancient Egyptians, The Romans, Tourism, Volcanoes and Earthquakes and Bristol.

Art and Design and Technology

Throughout the year in art and DT, the children will cover the following units: Painting (texture), Sculpture (Modroc & Wire Sculptures), Painting (Repeated Patterns), Shell Structures, Healthy Eating and Pneumatics.

Music

Throughout the year in music, the children will cover the following units: Performance, Composing and Singing

French

Throughout the year in French, the children will cover the following units: A New Start, Calendar and Celebrations, Animals I Like and Don't Like, Carnival and Using Numbers, Fruits and Vegetables and Going on a Picnic.

END OF YEAR 3 EXPECTATIONS

Reading

- Comments on the way characters relate to one another.
 Knows which words are essential in a sentence to retain meaning.
- Draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts & motives from their actions.
- Recognise how commas are used to give more meaning.

 - pronouns and how used
 - collective nouns
 - adverbs
- Can explain the difference that adjectives and verbs

Writing

- Use conjunctions (when, so, before, after, while, because).
- Use adverbs (e.g. then, next, soon).

- Experiment with adjectives to create impact.
- Correctly use verbs in 1st, 2nd & 3rd person.
- Use perfect form of verbs to mark relationships of time & cause.
- Correct use of speech marks for direct speech.
- Group ideas into paragraphs around a theme.

 Write under headings & sub-headings.
- Legible, joined handwriting.

Maths

- Compare & order numbers up to 1000.
- Read & write all numbers to 1000 in digits & words.
- Find 10 or 100 more/less than a given number.
- Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 & 100.
- Recall & use multiplication & division facts for 3, 4, 8 tables.
- Recognise PV of any 3-digit number.
- Add & subtract: 3-digit nos & ones / tens / hundreds
- Add & subtract:
 - Numbers with up to 3-digits using efficient written method (column).
 - Use inverse to check.
- Multiply: 2-digit by 1-digit Count up/down in tenths.
- Count up/down in tentns.
- Compare & order fractions with same denominator.
- +/- fractions with same denominator with whole.
- Know pairs of fractions that total 1.
- Tell time 12 and 24 hour clocks; use roman numerals.
- Tell time to nearest minute.
- Know number of days in each month.
