Year 3

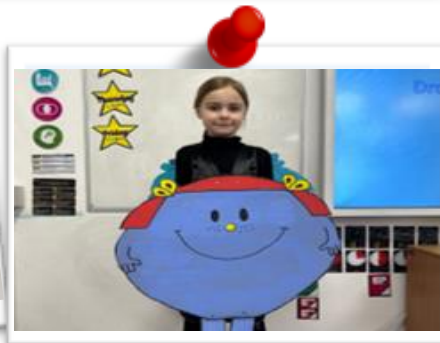
We have enjoyed all our learning this week. We have been learning all about the Easter Story and Good Friday in RE.

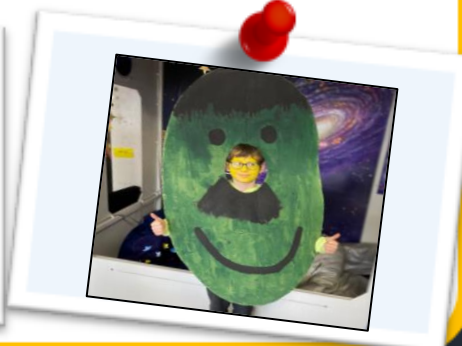
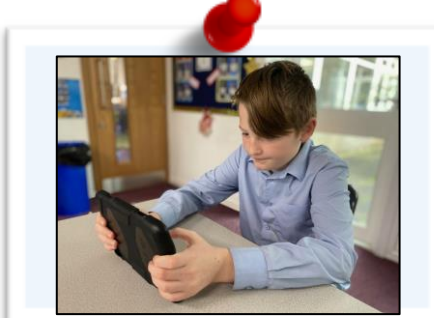
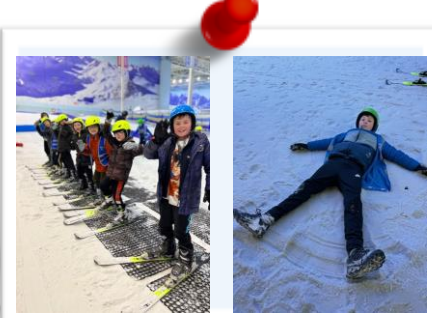
Year 6

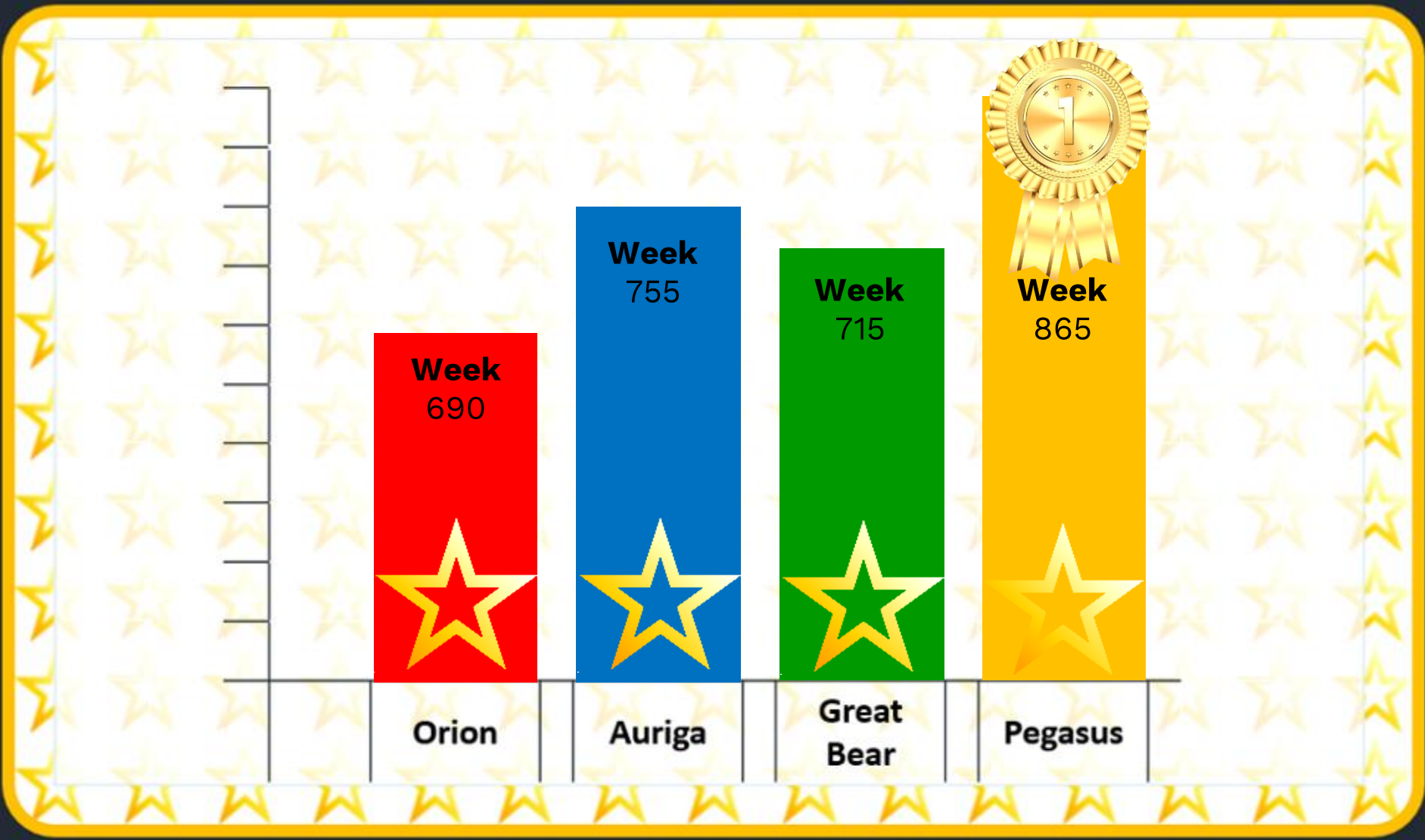

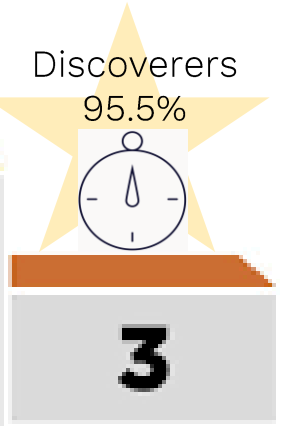
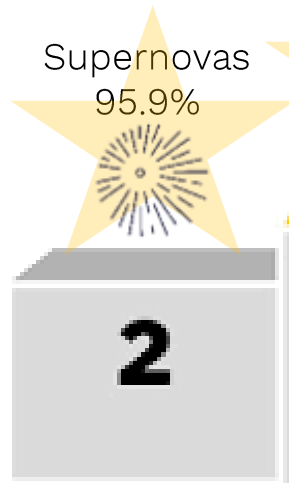
